Permits for alcohol use are available; the cost of liquor liability is \$175. A kitchen facility rental is available upon request for a \$20 fee per hour. An additional fee of \$25 per hour is required for the rental of broomball equipment.

Room and Party Rentals reservations include setup and cleanup time. Any extended rentals, equipment use and rentals remaining past the ending time of the contract or requiring additional clean-up costs incurred by the District will be charged a rate of \$50/hour.

"Scrub" Hockey & Open Shoot Hockey

In the 2012-2013 season, staff introduced new hockey pass types and fees. A Hockey Pass gave access to Youth Open Shoot and Adult Open Hockey times.

Daily open shoot was posted by 10 a.m. daily on the phone recording and internet calendar. Staff was able to make some posting of schedules and activities on the GPD website. No additional open shoot times can be added and only the listed times can be used for open hockey.

Rental Misc. Hockey: Due to the warm weather in the beginning of the season and end of the season, two adult hockey tournaments didn't use their time slots from previous years.

Utilities: Compressor and ice making machines were working all day in most cases because of high pre and post season temperatures.

Contractual Services: Companies such as RMC had 3+ service calls to examine and fix compressors due to high temperatures and constant running.

Misc. Expense: Cost associated towards repair of the fire panel at Watts.

Capital: Unbudgeted expense of purchasing rink dividers and new hockey goals due to safety concerns.

2013-2014 Net Budget Total: The increase to a net budgeted deficit of (\$147K) is attributed increase in salaries / wages and contractual costs for compressor maintenance along with Zamboni repair.

5. Recommendations for Watts Ice Center 2013-14

A. **Ice Schedule:** The Watts Ice Center will open Friday, November 29, 2013 through Monday, March 3, 2014.

B. **Public Skating/Token:** All Public Skating and Youth Open Shoot times will not change this year. Hockey punch passes were new last year and the hope is that patrons will have a better understanding of the difference between the hockey pass and the skating pass.

The Open Skate pass price structure will change due to the new RecTrac system. This will also require the pass holder to show the pass for verification. *Open skate passes will increase by \$5 per type compared to last year, between a 5-10% increase.* Pricing will be as follows:

- C. **Deposits for Permanent Renters:** The expectation this year is that permanent renters will pay half of their rental fees before November 29, 2013. Also, the Park District will expect to have a credit card on file so any remaining unpaid balance will be charged to the card on file on or about February 28, 2014. Winnetka Hockey will pay 50% by January 3, 2014 and the remaining balance will be paid near the end of the season within reason
- D. **Special Events:** Special events times and dates will occur during same time frame. Events will include skate a thon, winter carnival, skating exhibition, family nights and teen nights. Blackhawks night date and time will change to later in the season. The event will include a large movie screen to showcase a live Blackhawks hockey game.
- E. Watts Classic: The Watts Classic will look to creative marketing strategies to increase participation. There will be a greater emphasis on promoting the event by sending out flyers to local hockey groups and area hockey rinks. The dates of the tournament will be December 27-29 and January 3-5.

F. Holiday Break Schedule:

Holiday public skate will be December 23-27 and December 30-January 3 from 12:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m.. Christmas Day the Watts Ice Center will be closed.

G. Private Lessons:

Private lessons will not be run by the Park District and the responsibility of scheduling/coordinating will be dependent upon the skating instructor. The skating instructor will be considered an independent contractor not as an employee when teaching a private lesson. It will require that a \$5 per lesson fee be paid by the instructor before they can go on the ice. A general acknowledgement of the relationship between skating instructor and Park District will outline the requirements for private lessons. The management staff will be maintaining a close oversight on scheduling these lessons as not to affect the local group use and popular times for hockey games, classes and open skate.

H. **Ice maintenance:** The daily maintenance schedule for both ice rinks with emphasis on using the ice edger and quality standards in Zamboni operation. Zamboni/ice resurfacing training will be required for all Watts supervisory staff.

I. Open Hockey Fees:

All public skating and youth open shoot times will not change this year. Hockey punch passes were new last year and the hope is that patrons will have a better understanding of the difference between the hockey pass and the skating pass. Hockey pass will give access to youth open shoot and adult open hockey times. Adult open scrub players will not be allowed to use hockey punch passes this year. Hockey pass rates will increase by \$5 for 10 and 20 punch pass. Youth open shoot be reduced a Monday evening slot from 7:30-8:30 p.m. but will add 2 hours of ice time on Saturday from 1-3 p.m. in the studio rink.

J. Office Hours: To remain unchanged from last year.

K. Concessions:

The concession stand will continue to operate by GPD during special event times. Staff is recommending that the concession stand expand hours to Saturdays during public skating times (12:00 -4:00 p.m.).

L. Skating & Hockey Classes:

Skating & Hockey Programs- Youth skating classes will be held from December 3 through February 22 for the following classes: kinder blades, skate practice play, beginning rock n tots, and Saturday morning ISI classes. Staff is recommending a \$5 increase for all classes.

All dates and times will remain the same. The Adult Skating class will be cancelled and replaced by Adult Beginner Hockey. Parent & Me hockey will be cancelled and the time slot will be used during the Adult Beginner time slot. Adult Beginner Hockey will be on Sundays from 4-5 p.m. The Advanced Development Class for hockey will change its time on Wednesday's to Monday's from 7:30-8:30 p.m.

The adult skating time (11:30 a.m. -12:30 p.m.) on Saturdays will be changed to offer an additional Toddler and Basic ISI class due to popularity from previous years. The ISI winter break skating Pre Alpha will be cancelled and there will be only one session per level.

Toddler: January 2-4 from 12-1 p.m.

Basic: January 2-4 from 1-2 p.m.

ISI mini sessions have been a success since the beginning in 2011. The classes will begin January 21 to February 28 and keep the same format with times.

New Program:

Adult Hockey Class - introduced on Sunday afternoons for beginner adult hockey players.

M. Special Events

Skate-A-Thon (November) - Event will benefit the Lurie's Children's Memorial Foundation.

Chicago Blackhawks Night (December) - Rink Partner event benefiting the Chicago Blackhawks charity.

Winter Carnival (January) – Expanded to included events and activities. New activities will include several new games.

Skating Exhibition (February) – Will be an informal 15-20 minute program demonstrating basic skills by the beginner Saturday skating classes.

Watts Classic (Winter Break) – Area junior hockey players competing at our in house hockey tournament. Some changes to expenses and staffing to occur.

Teen Night (December & February) – Youth ages 12-17 are invited to skate on the main/studio. Activities include broomball, skating and DJ.

Winnetka Hockey Usage

It's important to note that the Winnetka Hockey Association pulled 3 hours of studio rink time per week for the 2013-14 season (36 hours total). The reason for this is that Winnetka Ice Arena built an outdoor rink that will run during the same operating time as the Watts Ice Rink. In the future, the Watts Ice Center will need to find renters or other programming options to fill these hours that Winnetka Hockey is dropping for this season. The loss of hours by Winnetka Hockey could become an expanding threat. The hours lost are on Tuesdays 5:30-6:30 p.m. and Saturdays 12:45-3 p.m. weekly in the studio rink. This year, the hours lost on Saturday will be filled by open hockey from 1-3 p.m.. There will be an effort to market to area leagues such as Wilmette Hockey, Glenview Stars, Northwestern Hockey, New Trier and Loyola Hockey Clubs to fill any additional hours that our lost.

Conclusion





Aside from the imbalance caused by one team having a goalie and the other not (which we fixed by taking our goalie out for our last game), there was no officiating whatsoever in our first couple games. The "refs" merely blew the whistle at every goal and did nothing to control the games;

- players were regularly roughed up and at great risk of injury. The coaches should also be required to help control their players as we did not see any intervention when players committed actions that should have been called penalties. Our last game was a little better but this is still a significant concern and will impact our decision to return to this event in the future.
- Need better staff. Disorganized event. Promote better within the local clubs. Don't conflict with NSIA so kids can join both events.
- Do not allow a clubs team to register together. Major selling point for Watts was to skate with new Schedules need to be set further in advance. I oo many players missed games because it was
- 4 impossible to plan for when the games would be. All schedules should be set two weeks in advance.
- More notification prior to tourney of details around timing/teams, etc. Also one size fits all uniform does not work well. Finally pre-assigned coaches would help a lot
- Make sure teams have kids from different ability levels mixed. For example, 2 elite players, 2 AA, 2 A, etc.
- I don't know. There was so much that was not good. Winnetka kids putting down Wilmette kids, refs talking badly about some of the players, etc.
